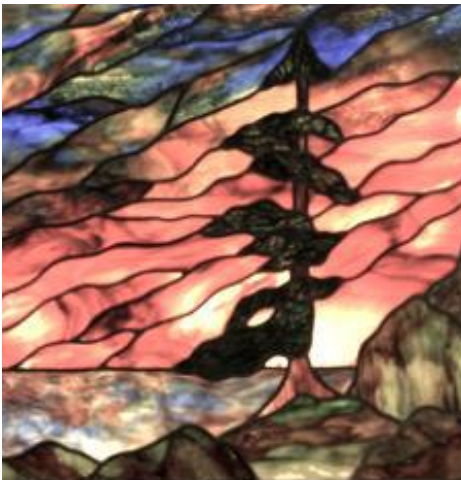
EDITOR'S NOTE

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE “CHURCH”? *by Jane Dawson, Minister Supporting Communities of Faith, Clusters and Networks*

As the church lives into this time of change, the traditional image of church as a building and a preacher is being expanded. For a variety of reasons, some communities of faith don't own any place of worship and are meeting in other, sometimes very different spaces such as schools and seniors' centres. Some are lay-led without paid clergy leadership. In these and other ways, “church” can look very different these days.

If you are part of a community of faith that does not have a building and/or paid ministry personnel, I would love to hear from you. First, it would be fascinating to learn more about the joys and challenges, grace and grit, of being the church as you discern what that looks like in your community. Second, through sharing stories, we can build a network – within EOORC and with communities of faith in other regions – for sharing best practices, exploring common questions and concerns, and gaining a wider sense of connection with others navigating a similar landscape.

For anyone whose community of faith falls anywhere under this general umbrella of being the church differently, please send me an email or give me a call to introduce yourself using the contact information provided below. I would love to know: your name, location, former Presbytery, status (congregation, ministry initiative, house church, new church plant, fresh expression), where you gather, style of leadership (lay, ordered, designated), and the size and profile of your membership. If anyone else knows of any such communities of faith but don't know if they are receiving the newsletter, please feel free to pass this message along (and tell them about the newsletter!).

As I hear from you, I am planning to organize an initial online gathering to bring you together to share experiences, stories, challenges and best practices and build a network from there!
