#### ARE YOU INTERESTED IN SERVING ON THE EASTERN ONTARIO OUTAOUAIS REGIONAL COUNCIL EXECUTIVE?

We invite anyone interested in serving on the EOORC Executive to fill out one or both of the **Expressions of Interest forms**, found on the last two pages of this newsletter. One of the forms is for the positions of President and President Elect, the other is for one of nine open seats available. **Please note that there will be no nominations from the floor at the Inaugural Meeting, so this is your only opportunity to submit your name, or to encourage someone else to put their name forward for consideration**.

The nominations committee will review all applications and make recommendations for an executive slate based on the gifts and visions of the applicants. Members will be designated to serve one-, two- or three-year terms to ensure overlapping turnover of the executive. As of the 2020 AGM, all new terms of service on the executive will be for three years, with the exception of the president-elect, president and past- president, which will each remain as one-year terms.
