MULTIFAITH HOUSING INITIATIVE by Sue Smarkala

Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI) is a not for profit organization in Ottawa that builds and manages affordable housing. It has four housing communities – Kent House, Somerset Gardens, Blake House and The Haven, in operation in Ottawa and a major project to house homeless veterans is underway – Veterans' House. MHI is made up of about 70 faith groups - Christian congregations, synagogues, mosques, temples and a number of other faith group organizations. For many years, it has been an important initiative of the United Church in the Ottawa area and our congregations continue to support fundraising for MHI initiatives. Using a supportive 'Housing First' model, Veterans' House specifically targets the needs of the rising number of homeless veterans who are 'living rough' in Ottawa. According to a 2015 survey conducted by the Alliance to End Homelessness, there are about 6,500 homeless individuals in Ottawa, and 8.5% of homeless persons surveyed reported Canadian military service.

- 40-unit home for veterans who are currently homeless
- Will include programs to help veterans deal with addiction issues and physical/mental health
- 3 floors of living space, 1 floor of communal space, and outdoor meditative/recreation areas
- Pilot project a solution to veterans' homelessness that can be replicated across Canada Veterans' House will be located at the former CFB Rockland Airbase, 745 Mikinak Rd

Quilts and Prayer Shawls Project

The United Church's project is **making quilts and prayer shawls** for the veterans to warm them and comfort them when they move into their new homes.

The project was initiated by Bonnie Cloutier-Clark. She is a nurse of 40 years and a quilter of 35 years. She has a family history with men who have served in the military. When she heard of MHI's Veterans' House on the news, she wanted to do something to support these veterans. Now, Bonnie, with some health issues is very grateful for UCC to become involved in this meaningful project.

We are planning that the quilts be brought to EOORC's Regional Meeting next June 2020. The quilts and shawls will be dedicated at that time and then returned to Bonnie for delivery to MHI. For more information, contact Dianne Cardin at dianne.cardin@sympatico.ca or 613-692-6210.
