A NEW DAY IS DAWNING — A REPORT by Co-Chairs, Rev. Kimberly Heath and Rev. Elaine Beattie

The meeting began by acknowledging First Nations territory with a welcome song and thanksgiving address by Grandmother Francine Desjardins and Knowledge Keeper Christina Bendevis. They called us to continue to be educated on and to advocate on behalf of the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls.

We then entered into worship with a delightful, entertaining and thought-provoking drama from the some of the Council's youth about God's Covenant with the people of God. It reminded us that we are connected to a journey of God's people that spans thousands of years and that throughout history, through change and challenge we have been called to follow and to trust that

we are not alone. Together we covenanted our Communities of Faith with staff and the Regional Council for our common purpose of living out the gospel of Jesus.

The Rev. Cathy Hamilton, who had led the Comprehensive Review process that was the bridge to this new structural change we are now living into, was our theme presenter.

We used the General Council 43 method of Listening, Discussing and Debating to work through the Governance Document which included the Vision Statement, proposed Leadership Teams, Executive and the Policies for the EOORC. The Listening and Discussing went very well but we ended up short on time when it came for the Debate. While this could have been quite frustrating there was enough trust that all of this was a beginning and a work in progress and there was a willingness to see various elements return to the Council in October for future discussion and decision.

Numerous reports and presentations were given such as the Budget (treasurer, Rev. Brian Cornelius) Stewardship (Rev. Trisha Elliott), Chaplaincy, Multi-Faith Housing Initiative, Healing Pathways, the Office of Vocation (Karen Valley), La Table (Rev. Éric Hébert-Daly), General Council Executive (Rev. Teresa Burnett-Cole, Rev. Arlyce Schiebout and GC guest Kate Rodd), as well as the report from our Executive Minister (Rev. Rosemary Lambie).

Worship wove its way throughout the meeting and included the leadership of Rev. Don Stiles, Rev. Takouhi D. Petro, Rev. Blair Paterson along with Commission and, Terrie Chedore, and Admission and, Rev. John Noordhof and vespers with Kevin Moratz and Rev. Natalie Istead. Music was wonderfully led by Kimberley Allen-McGill and the incredibly talented "Potluck Band" from across the Regional Council.

We were so blessed to have wonderful hosts from Trinity United in Smith Falls who welcomed us and made sure that every detail was attended to and that we were very well fed and watered all through the gathering.

On Sunday morning some woke up early to participate in the 5:00 a.m. sunrise service on Turtle Island hosted by the local Indigenous community.

We concluded our Regional Council with a Celebration of Ministry Service at Trinity United Church. During this worship service Rev. Kimberly Heath preached, Terrie Chedore was commissioned into Diaconal ministry and Rev. John Noordhof was received into ordained ministry in the United Church of Canada. Communion was celebrated and led by Rev. Rosemary Lambie and Rev. Don Stiles as well, those who had retired were celebrated, those who had died were remembered and finally our new President, Bronwen Harman, was installed. The welcome and ministry of Trinity United by the Rev. Christopher Ryan, music director, Wendy Stokes-Earl and the choir as well as everyone who served a bountiful lunch was gracious and generous and filled with love.

Our thanks go out to EVERYONE who helped in small and big ways to bring this event together. It takes a village to raise a child and it takes a multitude to bring together Regional Council so that we might be a vibrant United Church in this time and place.

Coming into the gathering we were aware that we were a diverse group from four different Presbyteries and two different Conferences who didn't know each other and had different cultures and expectations of how things should be. Through the worship and the listening, the discussion and the debate; through food and fellowship we felt united by the presence of our Creator and the call to live out Christ's mission as the Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council with a renewed hope, enlivened and empowered by the Holy Spirit.
