KANATA UNITED CHURCH INVITES YOU TO JOIN US FOR AN ARTS NIGHT FOR THE SEASON OF ADVENT, NOV 1 In May, KUC received a generous grant from the Calvin Institute of Christian Worship, in

Grand Rapids, MI, with funds provided by Lilly Endowment Inc. The funds support two Arts Nights over the course of 2019–2020, followed by an Art & Vespers service in April 2020 to celebrate the project.

The project gives us an opportunity to express our spirituality through the arts. It draws on a wide range of creative arts to explore the seasons of Advent and Lent, helping us to experience their present relevance in our context. Each night is led by a guest worship scholar with three or four artists, includes a meal, and time for learning, discussion and creativity. Special guest is Bill Kervin, Associate Professor of Public Worship at Emmanuel College, Toronto. He will introduce us to the "radical" way of telling time in the Church, while also exploring what Advent can mean for us today.
