I know many are setting your 2020 budgets and would like to get an estimate of how much the May 1-2 meeting at the Nav Centre in Cornwall will cost. We now have a better idea of costs for food and accommodation. The meal plan will be set at \$125. The menu is excellent and will appeal to all dietary restrictions and tastes. The room rates are as follows: **Standard:** 1 Queen Bed \$102, **Double:** Queen Bed + pullout sofa \$122, **Deluxe:** King + pullout sofa \$132. A limited number of specially-designed accessible rooms have been set aside at the rate of \$102.

FUNDING FOR VISITING MINISTRY PERSONNEL DURING SABBATICAL

This <u>policy and application</u> is useful information for pastoral charges, in particular, the smaller ones. The purpose of the fund is to provide funding to assist pastoral charges that would be subject to undue financial difficulty in funding supply ministry during a sabbatical leave of ministry personnel, and to encourage the vitality of ministry personnel who refrain from taking a sabbatical leave because of the financial difficulty of the pastoral charge.
