CALLING ALL EOORC CLUSTERS AND NETWORKS!

As we explore new ways to connect in response to Covid-19, this is a good time to check in with what is happening with clusters and networks around the region. I know there are many new groups already coming together, as well as many areas of shared interest where more new groups might form. It may also be that our new "social distancing" reality has kick-started a whole new approach to clusters and networks previously unimagined.

Whatever the circumstances, I would love to hear from you if:

- 1) you are part of a cluster or network that is taking shape
- 2) you have an idea for a potential cluster or network and would like to connect with others who share this interest Don't worry if you aren't sure whether your group or idea is a cluster or a network or something in between, whether it is large or small or whether it is intended to meet a short-term goal or be a connection that builds and lasts. The most important thing is to get a picture of how people are connecting and how we can best work together to support these emerging possibilities.

If you are <u>already part</u> of a cluster or network please provide a brief description of what is happening and who is involved (with contact information so I can get back to you).

If you have an <u>idea</u> for a cluster or network please let me know who and where you are and what your idea is, so I can connect you with others who share this interest.

After I hear from people (by May 15, 2020), there are a number of things that can be done to share these stories and ideas more widely:

- 1) organize a schedule of (online) sessions where you can share your cluster or network idea with anyone who is interested (people without a computer can connect by phone)
- 2) compile a regional list of information gathered and make this available through the EOORC website or newsletter
- 3) add this regional information to a national cluster and network database being compiled by the EDGE Network for Ministry Development
- 4) set some time aside at the Regional Meeting (possibly during one of the lunches) for people who share a common interest to gather face-to-face to build momentum and explore next steps.
