Communique from EOORC Executive and Finance Committee

Please find three important items of information for Pastoral Charges and Communities of Faith.

1. Interest Free Loans of up to \$10,000 for Community of Faith/Pastoral Charges facing critical cash-flow shortage to meet payroll and other necessary time sensitive bills

The Executive of EOORC has set up a process to facilitate interest-free loans of up to \$10,000 through EOORC or through the General Council for Community of Faith/Pastoral Charges facing a critical cash-flow shortage.

Applications need to be forwarded to Rosemary Lambie, Executive Minister RLambie@united-church.ca and copied to Brian Cornelius, Treasurer, brian.cornelius@firstunitedchurchottawa.org. Include in the initial application, the present bank balance and the amount of upcoming bills. Information on maturity dates for GIC's and other cash/investment holdings by the Community of Faith will be requested as well as information on giving patterns/methods and lost rental income.

2. Manse Funds

EOORC Executive has passed a policy removing the requirement for permission to spend the principle of manse funds if the manse fund had an initial principle valued *less than* \$100,000. The Executive recognizes that requirements for permission were lifted previously for pastoral charges in Bay of Quinte, and the Executive is presently reviewing past policies to make a recommendation for a harmonized policy in the Regional Council. Any perspectives, especially from Bay of Quinte pastoral charges with manse funds larger than \$100,000, is welcomed. Please note that this policy is related to manse funds only and to restrictions placed on funds for the sale of Church properties.

3. 10% Salary Subsidy through ADP

This is a reminder that ADP representatives for each Community of Faith/Pastoral Charge must add a representative from the General Council as an ADP representative in order to easily facilitate securing the 10% salary subsidy offered through the COVID-19 government emergency response. E-mails were sent to all ADP contacts in the community of faith. *This permission needs to be granted by April 20th*
