Connecting Online, Reconnecting with Scripture by Jane Dawson, Minister Supporting Communities of Faith, Clusters and Networks

In addition to online worship, COVID-19 is also prompting creative responses to engaging with scripture. Since the end of March, EOORC has been offering two online learning clusters with a biblical focus, facilitated by Jane Dawson, Minister Supporting Communities of Faith, Clusters and Networks.

In *Opening the Book*, participants listen together to podcast interviews with leading biblical scholars and discuss them afterwards. *Psalm Circle* explores the sacred poetry of the Psalms and how these ancient songs and prayers still speak to us today.

Both learning clusters have sparked a lively interest, bringing people together from many communities of faith in the region and beyond. They are open to anyone, at no cost, on a drop-in basis and will continue while physical distancing advisories are in place. Register for either session.


