





OTTAWA PASTORAL CARE TRAINING PROGRAM SERVING OTTAWA AND THE SURROUNDING AREAS

Our 10-member Advisory Board has been working diligently in virtual meetings to determine how to best continue to support the important work of pastoral/spiritual care in our communities especially during a time when the need is more urgent than ever. In March, all of our regular courses and events were postponed until such a time as we can once again meet together in person. In the meantime, we are now looking at providing a series of on-line sessions beginning with the very important topic of "Pastoral Care in an Era of Physical Distancing" by Joyce Hamelin.

ABOUT THE SESSION
