#### Veterans' House

- MHI has raised close to \$3 million towards its target of \$5 million for Veterans' House. While the COVID-19 pandemic has slowed down fundraising efforts, they are not halted.
- The project has been delayed by two months with a forecast completion of January 2021, due to a shortage of workers due to the pandemic.
- MHI is clear this project is guaranteed to be completed. They are on track and will not be moved off of this mission-critical focus.

#### A MESSAGE FROM CATARAQUI UNITED CHURCH, KINGSTON by Phyllis Lewis

Here at Cataraqui United Church, we offer a family style community of faith, mindful of the plight, needs and gifts of many. Our church, founded by families in the first wave of United Empire Loyalists, has been in the same location for over 225 years. In 2018, the property was designated by legislation under Ontario Heritage Act and the City of Kingston as a Heritage Site of Significance. We are located at 965 Sydenham Road and offer services starting at 10:30 every Sunday with a warm welcome of coffee and doughnuts before the service.

The cemetery which surrounds the church on three sides has recently changed its name to Heritage Cemetery at Cataraqui and has reopened its services to the public. The setting is quiet and dignified with many mature trees. The cemetery has graves dated over 200 years old and no room for casket burials remain. However, some previously unused sections are now open for in ground burial of cremation urns. The Cemetery Board consists of volunteers who devote many hours to the well-being of the cemetery and all aspects of its operation.
