# **RURAL CONNECT** by Rev Lynne Gardiner

In the EOORC, we have many Communities of Faith currently functioning without paid accountable ministry for many reasons. Sometimes, it's because there have been no



people considering a call to this place, and sometimes it's because the church no longer has the financial resources to consider hiring for this position. It's hard to find leadership in small, multi-point pastoral charges, particularly if the available resources can't support a full-time position.

This is not a situation unique to the EOORC. Many United Churches across all of Canada, but particularly rural United Churches have trouble finding ministry personnel despite the enormous gifts that rural communities have to offer.

Rural Connect is one option that is being considered by the EOORC as a resource for rural pastoral charges. It is a program that connects churches by satellite for worship, Christian education and other meetings. This unique program allows churches to be connected in an interactive way so they can participate fully from their own unique community or church. The system is not dependent on internet, which we know is notoriously unreliable in this area, but rather uses cell technology to bring the communities together. The system consists of a 'hub' that is the coordinating centre of the technology, with each connecting 'satellite' receiving a simple but fully interactive system that is as easy to operate as the volume control on your TV remote.

One of our rural Communities of Faith is considering becoming a 'hub' for this program if there is enough interest from other Communities of Faith joining in as 'satellites.' There is a cost to being part of this ministry, which is about the same as the costs to have pulpit supply; and yet, the connectivity will bring much more than Sunday morning worship. There is significantly more information available on the <u>Rural Connect website</u>. Take some time and watch the videos they have showing this technology in action. ### **ALIVE AND WELL IN THE TIME OF COVID-19**



On September 21, 2020, the Ottawa School of Theology & Spirituality (OSTS) will mark an important milestone. The School, originally known as the Ottawa Lay School of Theology, will begin its fifty-seventh year of classes. The OSTS was started in 1963 as part of an initiative by the United Church of Canada.

From its beginning, the School has had an ecumenical

focus and today it is co-sponsored by the United, Anglican, Presbyterian, and Roman Catholic churches. While maintaining its Christian roots, the School recognizes the importance of better understanding between Christians and members of other faith traditions, today many of our courses reflect this belief.

The School provides adult education classes, the aim of which is to provide theological and spiritual education to the laity and, in so doing, to deepen and strengthen their faith. There are no exams and no required text books to purchase – just some suggested reading. This year, as with many educational institutions across Canada, the COVID-19 pandemic has necessitated that we offer virtual classes. We will be using the Zoom platform. You will not require a Zoom account to participate in classes. Once you register for a course prior to classes, you will simply click on a link that will be provided by email.
