PLANNING TO REOPEN YOUR CHURCH FOR WORSHIP?

This plan needs to include the details of use of the building, seating arrangements for worship, ushering, entrance and exit plans, sanitizing, etc. In mid-June an email to this effect went out to all ministry personnel which contained many resources for developing your reopening **MORE INFORMATION**

MULTIFAITH HOUSING INITIATIVE (MHI)



Mark your calendars! In mid-September 2020, EOORC and Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI) are releasing a special Sunday service package highlighting veterans' homelessness. This service -- which churches can use on any Sunday of their choosing -- is an opportunity for your congregation to learn more about Multifaith Housing and to contribute financially toward the EOORC goal (to be set in October '20 at the AGM) to support MHI - Veterans' House.

This veterans' homelessness service – developed in partnership with Canadian Armed Forces Chaplain Andrew Love – will be available on the EOORC website in mid-September. The service was designed as "pandemic proof" as possible, to be used by congregations this coming church year 2020/21. It can be used regardless of whether you plan to host services in person, via pre-recorded video, or via online live streaming. This veterans' service is also easily customized by each congregation. Stay tuned for the prepared materials, which will include the service text in MS Word format, opening and postlude music, images, and several videos, as well as instructions on how to navigate the pieces of the service to suit your congregation's unique situation and technical capacity.

The kit will also include information on how your church/pastoral charge can get further involved in supporting MHI's Veterans' House project, set to open in January 2021. For congregation leaders currently scheduling their Sunday services for 2020/21: We'd be very grateful if you would consider **setting aside one Sunday this coming year** to host a service for homeless veterans.
