Burnstown United Church held its second annual Fish Fry fundraiser on August 14, 2009. We did it with a twist this year due to COVID-19 and we worked closely with the Renfrew County Health unit in order to keep both our volunteers and customers safe. It can be done!


We made our parking lot into a drive-thru and managed to process 132 cars and 371 meals in 3.5 hours. Pre-order only, we metered 20-minute time slots and we did not allow people out of their cars. We had such a good turnout that, unfortunately, we had to turn people away.

This was all done with a team of 12 volunteers and all of us including Rev. Kim had fun putting it together in a safe way. It became a good community outreach and the dollars we raised at the end of the day were double what we raised last year!

Good camaraderie for our volunteers and we plan to do it this way again next year. We see this as one of the good

workarounds that came out of this pandemic. Thank you God and we are extremely proud of Team Burnstown!

EOORC RIGHT RELATIONS NETWORK CALLS TO THE CHURCH STUDY CIRCLE

The Calls to the Church document articulates the Indigenous Church's vision for the future within the United Church of Canada.

The aim of this study circle is to listen to these calls and take them to heart.

The <u>Calls to the Church document</u> emerged from a process of discernment by the Caretakers of our Indigenous Council under the guidance of the Aboriginal Ministries Council (now National Indigenous Council). After a series of meetings and further review of the draft document, it was approved by General Council in 2018.

This study circle is an opportunity to listen attentively to these calls. It is intended as a practical action-oriented process for learning and taking these calls to heart.

The study circle will meet for six sessions, every two weeks (with some further reading between each session), facilitated by Jane Dawson. 
