#### UNITED WE STAND: THE EOORC CAMPAIGN FOR VETERANS' HOUSE

Hello EOORC! It's time!! We are launching our major fundraising campaign: **United We Stand: the EOORC Campaign for Veterans' House.** 

United We Stand, a joint partnership between MHI and EOORC, is a fundraising campaign in support Veterans' House, MHI's fifth housing community, scheduled to open in January 2021. All churches in EOORC are encouraged to support Veterans' House as they are willing and able. Part of that campaign is a "COVIDready" worship service package: United We Stand Sunday Service.

#### What's the United We Stand Sunday

Service? All churches are encouraged to set aside one Sunday between now and June 2021 to host the United We Stand Sunday Service. It is a complete Sunday service – bulletin, music, reflection, prayers. It is presented in a downloadable kit of service components that can be used any Sunday between now and June.



Congregation leaders are encouraged to use as many or as few of these components as they wish to prepare the service.

- A Sunday service bulletin
- The text of the reflection/sermon
- The following video pieces, in high resolution:



#### WOODWARK STUDENT BURSARY

OBJECTIVE

- To provide awards of money (approximately \$1000 per year but could be more or less depending on the number of successful applicants) to one or more candidates who are undertaking full-time studies directed toward full-time service in the United Church of Canada.
- Consideration shall not be limited to candidates for the ordained ministry of the Church.
- Any candidate whose objective is full-time service in the United Church of Canada will be considered.
- Preference will be given to those candidates from the Ottawa area or from Eastern Ontario.
