What is an Affirming Ministry?



- Been through an **educational and discernment process** about human diversity
- Made a **commitment publicly, intentionally & explicitly (P.I.E.)** to be inclusive of people of all sexual orientations and gender identities in all aspects of its life and work.
- **Broadens commitment** of inclusivity to include all people who are marginalized.

Affirming Ministry Program



- Started in 1992
 - signature program of Affirm United/S'affirmer Ensemble
 - to assist ministries within The United Church of Canada to be more equitable and affirming in the life and work of their ministries
- Currently 238 Affirming Ministries in the United Church – communities of faith, chaplaincy, regional councils, educational institutions, etc
- Over 170 in the Affirming Process

Who is Affirm United/ S'affirmer Ensemble?



- Merging of Affirm (1982) and Friends of Affirm (1984) in 1994
- **Goals: Educate, Advocate, Support**
- Volunteer organization primarily
 - supported by membership fees
 - endorsed by & in partnership with The United Church of Canada

Why Become Affirming?

We are already welcoming!

- **Educate**
 - to learn about and from people who are marginalized
 - to address unintentional/unrecognized bias – micro-aggressions
 - to learn appropriate/current language
 - to practice articulating questions/ comments respectfully





Why Become Affirming?

We are already welcoming! (cont)

- **Advocate – Action**
 - by being a role model for communities of faith & other ministries in the Regional Council
 - by eradicating systemic marginalization in hiring practices, support for employees, etc.
 - by supporting societal change – laws, etc
 - by using gender neutral language in conversation, meetings, worship, etc.



Why Become Affirming?

We are already welcoming! (cont)

- **Support –**
 - by providing space, as safe as possible, for people who are marginalized in all work of Regional Council
 - by providing knowledgeable pastoral care for all people both in the church and in society

How would a Regional Council become Affirming?



- **Educate –**

Who:

- Group or team to lead process
- Executive Group & Staff
- All committees/teams of the Regional Council
- Court as a whole

How:

- hear personal stories
- explore theological understanding
- hear from others of the impact on ministry
- address the justice aspects of being Affirming

How would a Regional Council become Affirming (cont.)



- **Document –**

Vision Statement – with language re “inclusion of people of all gender identities and sexual orientations in the life and work of the ministry”

Action Plan – outlining specific actions/plans for the future as Affirming Ministry . . . Signage, accessibility of meetings (hearing, mobility, etc.), annual education for committees/teams; annual membership in Affirm United, annual celebrations; addressing needs of people who are marginalized in other ways, etc.

How would a Regional Council become Affirming (cont.)



- **Vote** of members of Regional Council with 75% positive outcome
- **Make a commitment** by becoming a member of Affirm United/S'affirmer Ensemble
- **Celebrate!** – Hold a special worship service at which the Regional Council will be declared an Affirming Ministry and receive a certificate.
