AGING – With Care!

A 4-part series of Learning Cafés about Eldercare – how it is and how it could be: for our loved ones and ourselves

Nov 3 Eldercare Today: What's Available, and What Isn't!

7-8:30 PM

Most Canadians wish to age in their own homes for as long as possible. Our current system, however, relies heavily on institutional care (long-term care facilities and hospitals), the most costly and least effective of options. There are four stages of Eldercare: independent living, homecare, long-term care, and palliative care. This session will illustrate how the current system is failing to meet people's needs and wants at each stage.

Nov 10 Alternative Approaches to Eldercare

7-8:30 PM

Alternatives exist to our current institutional approach to Eldercare. This session will examine new models of Eldercare that are being implemented locally, nationally and internationally – approaches that are more responsive to the needs and wishes of people during each stage of the aging process.

Nov 17 Developing A Personal Eldercare Plan

7-8:30 PM

Planning ahead for the care needs of ourselves and our loved ones is essential. This session will examine both existing and potential models of elder care in our Ottawa community that can support us at each stage of the aging process. Participants will be provided with guidelines and resources to help them make a personal plan.


Nov 24 Making Change Happen

7-8:30 PM

Countless public inquires, commissions, and reports have identified the deficiencies of our current institutional model of Eldercare making consistent recommendations for change. Few have been implemented. To get the care we want – for our loved ones, and for ourselves – will require bold initiatives on the part of citizens and politicians. This session will focus on ways to make change happen through community-based initiatives and political advocacy.

The Woodwark Student Bursary Fund was established in 1976 by the Reverend Ken Woodwark and his wife, Ida, in memory of their parents George and Emma Woodwark and George and Katie McDowell. Reverend Woodwark was a Minister at Woodroffe United Church in Ottawa.

OBJECTIVE

- To provide awards of money (approximately \$1000 per year but could be more or less depending on the number of successful applicants) to one or more candidates who are undertaking full-time studies directed toward full-time service in the United Church of Canada.
- Consideration shall not be limited to candidates for the ordained ministry of the Church.
- Any candidate whose objective is full-time service in the United Church of Canada will be considered.
- Preference will be given to those candidates from the Ottawa area or from Eastern Ontario.
