A message from the EOORC Executive

With a new year just beginning, we feel this is a good time to remind EOORC members of the importance of communicating with each other in the manner that befits a Christian community. The United Church of Canada has adopted *Holy Manners* as a way to effectively support communication within our faith community. *Holy Manners* remind us that we are called into community with God at the centre. - keep God at the centre of everything we do,
- each speak for ourselves,
- speak for a purpose,
- separate people from problems,
- welcome the conflict of ideas,
- honour the decisions of the body, and
- commit to holding one another to account when we do not keep our holy manners

#### Wonderful News from the Multi-Faith Housing Initiative

Friends, never doubt dreams can come true! We are so excited to reach out to you about our latest affordable housing project and partnership with Dream, a socially and environmentally-focused developer from Toronto. As some of you may have heard on the news today, the National

Commission (NCC) announced that the <u>Dream LeBreton proposal has been selected to develop the Library Parcel at LeBreton Flats</u> -- and Dream is partnering with Multifaith Housing Initiative! This announcement may come as a surprise to many of you because our board and staff were required to keep all details confidential until the NCC announced the winning bid today.

We know everyone will be excited to support and apply to MHI's next affordable housing project. The building is anticipated to be ready in 2025 with move-ins beginning in 2026, so it will take time before we are able to accept applications.

At this time, we wish to thank you, our wonderful supporters, for bringing MHI to this point in our journey as an organization. It is because of our supporters that we are able to take major strides forward to help bring homelessness to an end in Ottawa.

#### Multi-Faith Housing Initiative Annual Membership

EOORC is a member of MHI and all congregations in the region may join. Organizations, not individuals, are able to become members. Membership is renewed annually beginning in January. The Membership Fee of \$100 can be sent by cheque to Multifaith Housing Initiative, 404 McArthur Ave, #206, Ottawa, ON K1K 1G8. Please note Membership Fee and the name of your congregation on the Memo line. Payment can also be made on-line by downloading membership forms.

The Annual Membership Fee covers the ongoing costs incurred throughout the year for all five locations: Blake House, the Haven, Kent House, Somerset Gardens, and Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building. This is in comparison to the funds raised by the Tulipathon in May where 100% of the proceeds go to rent subsidies.

Membership provides a tangible and visible support for the organization in its mission to provide safe, affordable, well-maintained housing in inclusive communities for those most vulnerable to homelessness. Members receive quarterly updates on MHI and its activities and gives voting privileges to a congregational representative at the AGM.


