Also, please note, if you make your Annual Declaration each year, you do not need to get a new police records check!

#### FROM THE VISION AND TRANSFORMATION LEADERSHIP TEAM

It's that time again! The deadline for the next submission for Vision and Transformation is March 31, 2023. As members of the Vision and Transformation Leadership Team, we hope you have heard about the grants we offer. Twice a year we receive and recommend grant applications from a variety of communities of faith which include all forms of ministry in our region. Grant recommendations are then approved at the next executive meeting of EOORC.

Grants approved from the October 31<sup>st</sup> submissions include the Rural United Ministry Cooperative visioning process, a rented bus for the EOORC Music United group, a Rainbow worship series at Trinity St. Andrews in Renfrew for the LGBTQ2+ community and their allies, a youth leader for Emmanuel United and a pastoral care nurse for Rideau Pastoral Charge

#### Here are the Stewardship Teams reasons for giving of their time.

**Dave Charles** During my training on time management during my "working" life I learned to spend my time on what is important to me. I also learned that life without service is a life without fulfillment. I spend my time on church, community, family, and friends because it fills me with purpose and satisfaction. God directs in book of Matthew "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind" and to "love your neighbour as yourself".
