St. Paul's Eastern Memorial Wall at MacKay United by Eleanor Dunn, MacKay United Church



Over the years, a close relationship developed between St. Paul's Eastern United Church in Sandy Hill and MacKay United Church in New Edinburgh. Pulpit exchanges and other activities cemented the relationship so it was logical for MacKay to step in and offer to create a space in its sanctuary for St. Paul's Eastern's memorial plaques when St. Paul's Eastern was closed last year.

Easier said than done, MacKay's Property Committee soon discovered after taking possession of the plaques. They were heavy and there were concerns that the plaster wall in MacKay United's sanctuary which had been chosen to become St. Paul's Eastern wall could not carry the weight.

A sturdy false wall was required. But as MacKay is a historic building, it wasn't just a matter of a few two-by-fours and some

plywood. The false wall had to match the original woodwork in MacKay's sanctuary. A carpenter specializing in matching woodwork in historic buildings was hired and the work commenced.

The result is a spectacular wall on which St. Paul's Eastern memorial plaques have been mounted. There are two World War I plaques — one from Eastern Methodist and one from St. Paul's Presbyterian. The two churches became one — St. Paul's Eastern United — as a result of Church union. There will be a dedication ceremony for the wall in the spring.

News from the General Council Office

Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization

The 44th General Council has authorized a remit on removing structural barriers so that the Indigenous Church can determine its place and structure within the United Church. The remit requires a vote by every regional council and each pastoral charge's governing body. Information about the remit, as well as voting cards, were sent to every regional council and each pastoral charge on March 10, either through email or Canada Post. Voting will take place **over the course of a year** between **March 15, 2023, and March 31, 2024**. Abstentions are considered a vote against the remit. **NOTE**: A regional council learning session about the remit may be offered prior to the regional council meeting in June 2023 for those who would like to learn more. The United Church is blessed to have rich diversity in its leadership. Our diversity makes us more capable of living out God's mission in our world. In sometimes ground-breaking ways, the United Church has affirmed commitments to supporting the full participation of everyone.


To help us more fully live out these commitments we have been collecting data, since November 2021, as part of the <u>Leadership Counts</u> voluntary survey to learn more about the breadth of identities present among The United Church of Canada's ministry personnel, General Council office and regional council office staff, and members of national committees. This includes racial identities, gender identities, sexual orientations, disabilities, languages, and more.

Individual data can now be viewed and updated: If you have completed the Leadership Counts survey, you can visit ChurchHub.ca to view or update your identity information at any time through the "My Identity Data" tile. You can still participate: If you are a ministry personnel or a member of a national committee and have yet to participate in this project, you can go to ChurchHub.ca and complete the survey through the My Identity Data tile.
