#### SETTING OUR SIGHTS! STRATEGIC PLANNING GROUP

The Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council has established a Strategic Planning group to lead the Regional Council in a process of reviewing the General Council Strategic Plan for 2023-2025 and shaping how the national plan fits with the needs and work of EOORC. This process in EOORC is called *Setting Our Sights*.

Eight people have been named to the Task Group: Cindy Casey (Kanata United, Ottawa), Liz Church (Portland), David Clemis (Orleans United, Ottawa), Paul Dillman (Riverside United, Ottawa), Mary Ruth Endicott (McKay United, Ottawa), Kimberly Heath (Wall St. United, Brockville), Sharon MacDonald (Sharbot Lake) and Mary Royal-Duczek (Almonte). Éric Hébert-Daly and Peter Bartlett are offering staff support.

The Setting Our Sights task group has met twice by Zoom and are working on designing a process which will be include time at the May 26-27 AGM meeting in Brockville.

The acronym for this group is SOS and that helps us to remember the urgency of this work as we respond to the General Council plan, but also as we discern God's call amidst the changing landscape of the church and the needs of our communities and world. What can we do together to support renewal in communities of faith? How can we make an impact on priority justice needs. How can we support and transform our models of leadership?

#### FROM THE VISION AND TRANSFORMATION LEADERSHIP TEAM

More good news and exciting possibilities from Vision and Transformation application grants recommended in April. I cannot forget the button maker. As a widely spread-out region, it can be a challenge to take advantage of tools available in only one place. The Inverary Battersea youth cluster would like to purchase a button maker to network, promote voices for pride, clean water and so on, and explore questions of faith.

The Rural United Ministry will use a series of stories, supported by an professional story teller, to connect its diverse membership and consider their roles to meet community needs.

The House of Lazarus is an outstanding outreach organization serving the Grenville, Dundas and Stormont counties through a myriad of programs. "Getting Ahead in Just Getting-By World" is going to use investigation and discussion to better understand the causes of poverty. Then it is mean to help participants to understand their unique situations and envision what life could be like.

Sometimes it just takes a logo to bring folks together. Osgoode -Kars united has recently amalgamated. A new logo will create identical signage for each church building. A local artist will create a quilt that connects the history of each church. The logo will be reproduced in many formats.

And then there is the Elgin United Church which last year reached out to youth of the community with speakers, snacks, bussing, movies and so much more. This year they would formalize the relationship with the North Leeds Youth Council recognizing the funding cut from United Way. Elgin will continue to partner and fundraise to support this new ministry. Next there are the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> years of multiple year grants in progress. Several of the current applications represented multiyear proposals. Note that proposals up to 3 years can be accepted.

Have you already received a grant? Please tell us your story. Did it work as planned? What were the lessons learned? Did one of these grant stories spark your dreams of what your community of faith could undertake? Maybe you have a completely different project in mind? We look forward to hearing from you in the fall.

From the desk of Rev. Whit Strong Minister for Pastoral Relations



- 1. Are you available for Sunday Supply? The Pastoral Relations Commission is compiling/updating a list of ministry personnel who are available to do occasional Sunday Supply.
- 2. **Pastoral Relations Liaisons:** At any given time, we have a number of Pastoral Charges who are experiencing a change in pastoral relations. In their search for a new minister, it is necessary for them to be accompanied through this process by a Pastoral Charge Liaison whose role it is to assist in the creation of a vacancy profile for *ChurchHub*, as well as participating in the actual search. We are currently short of people available to journey with congregations as they look for a new minister. If you would like to know more about what is entailed in serving the Regional Council in this capacity, we would love to hear from you. Initial training and ongoing support is always available.
- 3. Sacraments Elders: Communities of Faith who are expecting to be without a called or appointed minister for an extended period of time are invited to consider having a suitable person from within your congregation be trained and licenced as a Sacraments Elder.
- 4. **Pastoral Charge Supervisors:** Pastoral Charges who are without called or appointed ministry personnel are required to have a Pastoral Charge Supervisor. A reminder to those Communities of Faith who currently have a PC Supervisor, it is EOORC policy that you reimburse them for the time they are with you in meetings at a rate of \$30/hour (including any travel time), plus \$.55/km for travel. Ministry Personnel within EOORC are invited to offer themselves to serve in this important capacity.
- 5. **Is your Community of Faith searching for a new minister?** Pastoral Charges who are in search for a new minister must work with a Pastoral Relations Liaison. A reminder to those who are currently in this situation, it is EOORC policy that the pastoral charge reimburse the PR Liaison for travel at a rate of \$.55/km.
