STORIES FROM THE HEART Storytelling Workshops for Church Communities

Professional storyteller Deborah Dunleavy offers sessions for church communities who are experiencing times of discernment. Deborah tells traditional stories to spark conversation, and encourages others to tell personal stories to one another in a compassionate caring setting. Currently Deborah is engaged by Rural United Ministry (R.U.M) and is leading storytelling sessions with the five collectively connected churches.

"By being more intentional about building a 'relational culture' in our churches... (ie: through storytelling) ...we can be enriched in the discernment of what God is doing amongst us and how God might be calling us to move forward."
