

#### **LLWLs and Sunday Supply**

Many of our pastoral charges are engaging our LLWLs for Sunday leadership. Here is a reminder of the proper compensation for their work:

- \$232 for Sunday Worship leadership
- \$.55/km for travel to and from your pastoral charge
- Have payment ready for the LLWL each Sunday they are with you.
- Provide a T4A tax slip at the end of the year for services rendered, but do not include travel reimbursement on the T4A slip.

#### Retired Ministers – Are You Available For Pulpit Supply?

EOORC needs ministers to do occasional pulpit supply, particularly to help out in administering the sacraments. The geographic areas most in need are the western part of EOORC, the areas formerly known as Four Rivers and Upper Valley Presbyteries. Please contact Rev. Whit Strong if you are available.

#### Sacraments Elders Training

Communities of Faith who are expecting to be without a called or appointed minister for an extended period of time are invited to consider having a suitable person from within your congregation be trained and licenced as a Sacraments Elder. EOORC is offering a six-session training course (on Zoom) for Sacraments Elders beginning in September. If your pastoral charge has a suitable person to put forward as a potential Sacraments Elder, please contact Rev. Whit Strong as soon as possible.

PLEASE JOIN US! On Tuesday, September 5, leaders of four major church denominations will join the voices of supporters at Camp Marcedes and Camp Morgan urging provincial political leaders to give the go-ahead to search the Prairie Green Landfill for the remains of two missing Indigenous women, Morgan Harris and Marcedes Myran. Harris has been missing since May 2022, and Myran since March of last year. More information
