The Setting Our Sights (SOS) Strategic Planning Working Group spent October 6th together at Portland United Church. It was a time of discerning what we had heard through the consultation process as we focus the priorities for the work of Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council (EOORC) for the next few years. The report is now being written and it will be presented at the November 4th EOORC meeting.

The report will follow the "Strategic Objective" themes in the General Council Strategic Plan 2023-2025: Growth, Justice, Climate, Leadership, Indigenous Pathways and Common Good. Some of these themes are more connected to the responsibilities of a regional council than others.

The report will be available prior to the November 4th meeting, and the goal for that release will be Wednesday, Oct 25th. 

Compensation for Pastoral Charge Supervision Policy

The Community of Faith receiving supervision will be responsible to pay for the supervision. Costs will be \$30 per hour (hours include meeting plus travel time), plus travel reimbursement at the General Council rate to and from the meeting site. All mileage and the hourly rate will be paid to the supervisor by the Community of Faith being supervised. If individuals receiving remuneration do not wish to receive payment, they are free to donate the payments at their discretion, but in no way does this excuse the receiving ministry site from making the payment.

Woodwark Student Bursary

The Woodwark Student Bursary Fund was established in 1976 by the Reverend Ken Woodwark and his wife Ida in memory of their parents George and Emma Woodwark and George and Katie McDowell. Reverend Woodwark was a Minister at Woodroffe United Church in Ottawa.

OBJECTIVE:

- To provide awards of money (approximately \$1000 per year but could be more or less depending on the number of successful applicants) to one or more candidates who are undertaking full-time studies directed toward full-time service in the United Church of Canada.
- Consideration shall not be limited to candidates for the ordained ministry of the Church.
- Any candidate whose objective is full-time service in the United Church of Canada will be considered.
- Preference will be given to those candidates from the Ottawa area or from Eastern Ontario.



Solidarity Circles: A peer network of clergy, faith leaders and organizers interested in the solidarity economy

Are you passionate about building a more equitable and sustainable future? You are invited to join the Solidarity Circles — a transformative 9-month leadership training program aimed at empowering individuals to align their institutions and communities with the principles of the Solidarity Economy. Broadly understood, the cooperative and solidarity economy are ways of addressing longstanding economic inequalities within our society, including white supremacy and gender and sex inequities. As part of its commitment to collaborative ministry that engages local communities, the program is a unique partnership between the United Church and the Wendland-Cooke Institute (Vanderbilt University Divinity School). Solidarity Circles are virtual peer-networks for faith leaders, organizers, clergy, and members of the community interested in the cooperative and solidarity economy and its multiple relations to faith.
