Repayment of CEBA Loan –In anticipation of the repayment of federal Canada Emergency Business Account 'CEBA' loan, the United Church has developed a repayment program for UCC congregations who find themselves struggling to fully repay their commercial CEBA loans – which would trigger foregoing the already accounted for forgiveness portion. We have created a loan program to support our congregations through this transition. To take advantage you must respond prior to December 10, 2023.

To provide bridging support, the national office is prepared to facilitate a swap out of the commercial loan and replace it with a UCC loan. In short, UCC would issue loans of \$30,000 or \$40,000 for the express purpose of paying off CEBA. All eligible United Church CEBA loan holders in good standing with UCC are able to take advantage of this loan at an interest rate of 5.0%. First payment comes due February 1st, 2024.

To get started simply complete the loan agreement <u>UCC – CEBA loan closeout (2023)</u> and forward to Maria Pimpinella at <u>mpimpinella@united-church.ca</u> along with a copy of void cheque. It's that easy!

Licenced Lay Worship Leaders

We currently have 49 LLWLs in EOORC. Many of them are very active offering Sunday worship leadership to our Communities of Faith. On an annual basis, each LLWL is relicensed following a request to do so by their governing body. With so many of our smaller Pastoral Charges without called or appointed Ministry Personnel, our LLWLs serve a very important function. In addition to the currently licenced LLWLs, we have five people at various stages of the LLWL training. Anyone expressing an interest in being a LLWL – following a letter of support to the EOORC LLWL Team from their governing body – is interviewed by the EOORC LLWL Team prior to and following their taking the UCC-sponsored online LLWL course.

Sacraments Elders

Sacraments Elders are lay people who have been trained and licenced to preside over the sacraments in their home pastoral charges when their pastoral charge has been – or is expected to be – without called or appointed Ministry personnel for an extended period of time. This licencing does not extend beyond the boundaries of the Sacraments Elder's own pastoral charge. In the event that the pastoral charge acquires a minster through a call or appointment, the Sacraments Elder's licence expires. We currently have four Sacraments Elders licenced and seven more people are in our EOORC-led training program. A licence to perform the sacraments needs to be renewed annually at the request of their respective governing bodies.

Authority to Licence for the Sacraments

Traditionally, the authority to licence people within EOORC to perform the sacraments is held by the Regional Council, normally through its Executive following a request to do so by the Pastoral Relations Commission. Recently, in order to streamline this process the Executive of EOORC has given the Pastoral Relations Commission the authority to licence Diaconal Ministers, Designated Lay Ministers, Candidates for Ministry serving pastoral charges, and Sacraments Elders.








HEATHER MENZIES
