Attendees were invited to arrive in-person and connect online prior to the meeting being called to order, for registration and a time of fellowship.

Call to Order

"In the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, the only sovereign head of the Church, and by the authority of the Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council of the United Church of Canada, I hereby declare this general meeting duly constituted and to be in session for conducting the business which will properly come before it."

Welcome (instruction about washroom and food table)

Sue Hutton, DLM, President, welcomed all to the meeting and went through some housekeeping items (access to Wi-Fi, washrooms, meal plan, introducing chaplains, scrutineers and stewards, parliamentarian, Executive Minister and recording secretary).

Rev. Eric Hebert-Daly, Executive Minister announced that the meeting had access to simultaneous equipment, simultaneous translators, and accessibility to translations on Zoom.

Acknowledging the Land

Petra Heath led the land acknowledgement. She shared her joys of living in Brockville, in particular the river that runs along; and the history of the river and how traditionally the river was used to connect people and not divide - as it does today, serving as a border). Petra highlighted that the border is not the only divide between people today, and there still exists a large divide between First Nations Peoples and settlers. Petra shared her own inspirations to work towards truth and reconciliation and right relations.

Brockville is locating in/on the Mohawk territory of the Haudenosaunee/Rotinonhsho'n:ni people and the unceded, traditional Algonquin territory of the Anishinaabe people. This is covered by the Crawford Purchase Treaty (1783).

Welcome from local dignitaries

Mayor: Matt Wren, Mayor of Brockville, welcomed delegates to the town of Brockville and shared some of the history of Brockville. Brockville is the oldest municipality in the Province of Ontario. The Mayor also highlighted the Brock trail and invited all to visit it.

Rev. Dr. Kimberly Heath, Minister at Wall Street United Church, welcomed all delegates on behalf of the United Churches in the area (both St. John's United Church and Wall Street United Church) – Kimberly shared some of the ministries taking shape at her church, and wished all to a good meeting

Terrie Chedore, Diaconal Minister, extended a welcome to this land from First Nations Peoples. Terri shared her personal history and her family's generational relationships with First Nations Peoples of this land. Terrie highlighted that systemic racism still exists and called all to work against this reality.

Rev. Dr. Teresa Burnett Cole, from the Wolf Clan of the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory, shared the Ojibwe Travelling song, which is considered an intertribal song; can be used and shared widely. Teresa also welcomed delegates to these lands.

United Church of Christ

Rev. Howard Cain was introduced, and brought greeting from the Church of Christ in the USA. Howard shared that the United Church of Christ is restructuring, and his representation will be bordering both the Eastern Ontario Outaouais and Nakonha:ka regional Councils. Howard announced that the United Church of Christ is also supporting the translation of the Bible in Mohawk project. The United Church of Christ is looking forward to continuing and strengthening relationship with The United Church of Canada.

Mary highlighted that her church has investments managed through the foundation, and this has made dealing with church finances much easier. The foundation has recently launched a Facebook page and all were invited to visit it. Mary invited participants to meet with her throughout the meeting to ask questions.

Break

A five-minute break was had by all.

Opening Worship

The worship leaders were Nicole Beaudry, Rev. Dr. Kofi Akoussah. Both introduced themselves. At the beginning of the worship, the theme song was sung ("Courageous Communities" written by Pay Mayberry). Afterwards, Rev. Akoussah led with an opening prayer. Following the prayer, all sang him MV 21 "Open our Heats" (Ouvre nos coeurs). The scripture readings were Joshua 6:9 and Isaiah 41:9, 10 and 14. Nicole Beaudry shared a reflection on the theme, 'Courageous Community' and highlighted the expression "Stay calm be brave wait for the signs". Scriptures tells us, "Do not be afraid, I am with you" in the Exodus stories. Nicole expressed that the church is being called to change, and this requires it to be

strong and courageous, which know that God is always present, and providing help and encouragement. Rev. Akoussah shared a prayer following this reflection, in particular, petitioning for God's graces to help us on the Church on its journey towards change. Afterwards, hymn MV 90 "Don't be Afraid" was sung. An adapted prayer of Our Father (written by Rev Eric Hebert-Daly) was shared. A closing prayer was read in unison.


Rev. Paul Dillman shared background information for how the task group was formed in response to The United Church of Canada's Strategic Plan. Following which, those in attendance were asked, to respond to the following questions:

- 1. What are the gifts and possibilities of the Regional Council
- 2. What are the obstacles that affect our life and role as Regional Council?

Following the 20 mins discussion, Rev. Eric Hebert-Daly, Executive Minister, introduced the Strategic Plan in further detail and its purpose. Eric proposed that the 'why' for the church's strategic plan is to focus work, priority setting, create measurable objectives, build on commitments, and be a statement of faith in the future.

The Process that led to creating a strategic plan was the following: General Council 43 – proposal; 2020-2022 Town Halls; adopted vision & call – April 2022; General Council Office plan adopted – November 2022 and invitation to rest of the church. The Executive of EOORC approved a process, created Setting Our Sights Working Group, is proposing a Existing Mission Statement & National Statement, is creating a side consultation process and listening phase.

Living Call Statement

As we seek to carry out this ministry, we will be intentional about how we fully include all in Christ's love and service. (Educational) Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization

It was agreed by consensus that, because the meeting was ahead of schedule, the court could begin discussing Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization at 11:10 AM instead of 11:30 AM. At this time, Rev. Takouhi-Demirdjian-Petro presented the following (Except) – which was also provided to table groups:

Remit process

Both Regional Councils AND the governing bodies (councils or boards) of pastoral charges vote on remits.

May 26-27, 2022 Brockville Memorial Arena Brockville, ON,

A majority must be obtained for each group (Regional Councils and Pastoral Charges).

A vote by members of the Regional Council does not indicate a congregation's support. These are two different things.

Failure to vote by the end of March 2024 is the equivalent of a 'no' vote. The 'yes' votes must exceed 50% of pastoral charges and 50% of regional councils.

Only 'yes' and 'no' can be recorded for this vote. No abstentions can be noted.

Why vote now?

By voting now, the Regional Council encourages congregations to begin their processes as soon as possible. In some cases, there may be need for educational time and discussion.

Does this mean the indigenous church wants to separate?

The motion is clear – an autonomous indigenous church would be established WITHIN the United Church of Canada.

We want to see the structure before we vote!

In an effort to decolonize our thinking and to live into being courageous community, we are making an intentional decision to not dictate or control the model that the indigenous church adopts that would suit its culture and its needs. That is why this remit is structured the way that it is, and why we do not have specific answers about the structure.

What will this cost?

The budgetary envelope for the indigenous church (while small relative to the wider church) has existed for years and would continue to exist in largely the same format.

Microphones opened for debate

Setting Our Sights (Continuing of Yesterday's Presentation)

Rev. Kimberly Heath, member of the Setting Our Sights working group highlighted that the church is entering Pentecost (tomorrow), and reminded all of the retreating following the resurrection of Jesus.
