We are pleased to recommend grant applications to those communities of faith who want to discern the way forward and to those who have found innovative new ways to pursue their dreams. Join a CCS Friday on Dec 8 at 12:00 CT for an online discussion about engaging youth in climate justice. This summer, 15 youth from across the church participated in the United Church of Canada's first ever Climate Motivators program. Each student was sponsored by, and in partnership with, a local community of faith where they worked together on local climate justice or environmental needs.

The motivators connected online and in-person to learn how to be leaders, worship, be in nature, act for change, and influence church policy. Our special guest will be Amy Crawford, team leader for Faith Formation and Mission with the General Council of the United Church of Canada. Amy has just returned from a short sabbatical where she was reviewing and evaluating what happened to the youth and the people they interacted with. She will share some of her insights about getting youth involved in educating about climate change.

News from the General Council Office

The United Church of Canada Letter to Prime Minister Justin Trudeau – Israel – Gaza — A letter signed by The Executive of the 44th General Council, National Indigenous Council, The United Church of Canada was sent out on November 19, 2023 to the Prime Minister:
