

Harmonious space is the condition in which diversity and inclusion truly grow. Guided by author and educator bell hooks, who said, "Learning takes place in harmonious space" and "Community that allows for risk, the risk of knowing someone outside your own boundaries is love." We will consider harmony and risk as opposed to "safety" as the best environment suitable for diversity.

Our special guest will be Deaconess Adrainne Gray. Adrainne was consecrated a Lutheran Diaconal Association (LDA) deaconess and ordained an Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) deacon in 2017.
