A Long-term Friendship with MHI by Sue Smarkala

This is the first of an informational series on Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI). Over the next few issues, you will learn about the significant work being done by MHI and its committed membership.

My name is Sue Smarkala and I am the President of MHI. In 2019, I started to volunteer with MHI as the United Church Representative on MHI's Board of Directors and as Board Ssecretary. Beginning at 'ground zero', I knew very little about affordable housing.

MHI is a charitable organization, created in 2002. It is operated by five staff and numerous volunteers. It is a unique organization whose membership consists of many different faith groups such as The Bahá'i Community of Ottawa, Christian communities (Centertown Churches Social Action Committee, Longfields Community Church, Sequoia Community Church, The King's Daughters and Sons Apartments), Christian churches (Anglican, Baptist, Lutheran, Mennonite, Presbyterian, Quaker, Roman Catholic, Salvation Army, United Church), and Hindu, Jewish, Muslim and Unitarian. Every April these members come together to attend an Annual General Meeting to consider topics of importance to MHI's work.

I quickly learned that the Ottawa Presbytery was active in fundraising for MHI's The Haven, a new build in Barrhaven which opened in 2016 with 98 units. Altogether, UCC raised approximately \$103,000. The Community Room was named in honour of Dr. Anne Squire, past Moderator of the United Church, in recognition of this financial support. Phyllis MacRae, retired Rev. Dianne Cardin, and Rev. David Sherwin were very instrumental in nurturing the relationship between the Ottawa United Churches and MHI.

Early on in my volunteer time, a supportive housing site for veterans was approved. I became involved with fundraising for the Capital Campaign with retired Rev. Dianne Cardin and the EOORC. Our combined efforts in 2019-2020 raised about \$160,000. A plaque recognizing this contribution was placed in the Andy Carswell Building community kitchen space.

The United Churches within Ottawa and the United Church of Canada Foundation, have long supported MHI. Several United Churches: Barrhaven, Emmanuel, MacKay, Orleans, Parkdale, Rideau Park, Southminster, and Trinity UCCs, joined MHI's membership in 2003; Ottawa Presbytery, led by Lillian Roberts, became members in 2005 and the UCC membership continued to grow. My own church, Woodroffe United, joined MHI's membership in 2016. As of 2023, MHI membership consists of about 35 United Churches.

As you see, the EOORC United Churches are very much involved and active with MHI. Few congregations on their own can build affordable housing. Becoming a member of MHI (\$100/yr.) is a way your congregation can publicly show your support for and commitment to affordable housing. To learn more visit www.multifaithhousing.ca

Private Refugee Sponsor Network


