Remit 1 – Results

Remit 1 has passed! Many people participated in this process throughout the Church. All 16 voting regional councils, the National Indigenous Council, and just over 80% of pastoral charges voted. Here are the results by the numbers:

- The National Indigenous Council, and the 16 voting regional councils: Yes: 17 No: 0
- Pastoral charges: Yes: 1482 No: 93 (That is 94% "yes.") The General Council will be asked to enact Remit 1 when it meets in



Ottawa West End Community Chaplaincy A Social Justice Story By: Anita Jansman

The Ottawa West End Community Chaplaincy (OWECC) is a grassroots ecumenical program that serves the multicultural, multi-faith neighbourhoods (Morrison Gardens, Pinecrest Terrace, Regina Towers, McEwan Towers and Foster Farm) of Pinecrest-Queensway. The OWECC is led by Rev. Lorrie Lowes (Bell's Corners UC) and Rev. Tamara Connors (Parish of South Carleton, Anglican Church).

"We provide a ministry of presence," says Rev. Lowes, adding that "the living conditions are not easy in these neighbourhoods." The daily challenges of poverty, isolation, mental health, and other marginalizing forces lead to a wide range of social problems. The OWECC aims to offer a possibility for empowerment and more abundant living.

Some of the OWECC's initiatives have included being present at food banks to help people fill out forms while offering them a cup of soup. At Morrison Gardens, a spiritual program welcomed women of all faiths to participate in mindfulness activities. A weekly prayer circle occurs on Sundays at Regina Towers. Before COVID, OWECC arranged an annual day away from the city to a tranquil natural setting. As the world opened up, Camp Otterdale, in Lombardy has welcomed folks from the OWECC neighbourhoods to a whole weekend of food, fellowship and fun each year.

"People need a chance to sit and talk with somebody who will listen," says Rev. Lowes. Unfortunately, since the pandemic, the chaplaincy has been struggling to get their footing back in the neighbourhoods. People are not gathering socially at the food banks, and a degree of bureaucracy from social agencies has seeped in, making it harder to get commitments of support. Rev. Lowes and Rev. Connors are working toward setting up a regular time and space each week at each of the five locations.

Communities of Faith in EOORC support the OWECC, the largest contributor being Bells Corners United Church. Others support individual programs.

The OWECC is a fine example of the social justice work that's taking place throughout EOORC.

As Rev. Lowes puts it, "We want to help people make their lives more purposeful, to make them feel heard, to make them feel human."
