Rev. (1:30 PM) General Council/General Council Executive Report

Rev. Arlyce Schiebout, Member of the General Council Executive, shared the General Council Executive Summary, September 22 - 23, 2023 (Appendix C). Arlyce also shared information about the Lloyed Hope Bequest, which is at \$9 million, is the second largest ever received by The United Church

of Canada. An equivalent amount was bequeathed to Fallowfield United Church, close to where Mr. Hope lived. The General Council Executive followed the the policy of allocating 50 percent of the bequest to the Foundation and 50 percent to supporting reconciliation efforts and Strategic Plan initiatives.

Rev. Brain Cornelius, Regional Council Treasurer, shared a financial report (Appendix D^1) and an extended version of the financial report which included the 2024 budget (Appendix D^2). Some of Brian's talking points included:

- The Finance Committee will present a proposed 2024 budget following the discussion and decisions adopted through Setting Our Sights.
- The Finance Committee has been grappling with the implications of the General Council Executive decision to reduce the Mission and Service Fund grant by 25% or \$80,000. This reduction is in addition to the anticipated deficit of \$40,000 to \$50,000 in 2023.
- These deficit figures present a considerable financial challenge to the Regional Council and will have an impact on EOORC Mission Support grants since these grants are exclusively funded through Mission and Service Fund.

2023-11-04_005 MOTION (Brian Cornelius/Christine Kilburn) that the Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council adopt in principle the proposed Budget framework. **CARRIED**

Following Brian Presentation, questions and discussion were had. Below are some of points captured:

- EOORC United Church Women (UCW) may have funding available to Golden Lake Camp
- Part of The Evangelical United Brethren joining with The United Church of Canada was the continued support of their church camps (see **Appendix E** as source of verbal submission to financial report/budget cuts)
- The Fertile Soil Project costs is covered by the General Council Office.
- There is room within the proposed budget for the activity streams proposed by the Strategic Plan
- \$60,000 decrease was a decision of the general council and it is an equitable decision for all regional councils and global partners.
- In 2025-26, the Regional Council will aim for a balanced budget.

- 6. Support the work of leadership teams who have or develop goals for their own work eg. Vision and Transformation, Righting Relations, YAYA
- 7. Annual support for AUSE in the form of membership fees and support for a representative to attend the Annual Conference and AGM when it is in our area.
- 8. Use of AUSE signage on correspondence, printed material, projections, and outdoor signage for office and meetings.

Accountability will be to regional council leadership teams, the Executive, the Meeting Planning Leadership Team , EOORC and AUSE

This was followed by a Prayer led by Roxanne Akhtar and the sharing of a personal story from Calvin Neufield. Rev. Takouhi Demirdjian-Petro brought greetings on behalf of Affirm United and presented the regional council with its affirm certificate, which was followed by the singing of Halle, Halle, Halle. Rev. Eric Hebert-Daly, Executive minister, shared a reflection which was followed by a closing prayer led by Linda Stronski. This time of celebration and worship was concluded with the singing of hymn MV 145 Draw the Circle Wide.
