#### MHI Launches United We Dream

On June 1, 2024 EOORC passed the motion for congregations to participate in fundraising for MHI's new housing development, Dream at LeBreton Flats. Over the next two years (December 2026) congregations will work towards a fundraising goal of \$150,000. Rev. Dr. Teresa Burnett Cole of Glebe St. James has created an Indigenous style worship service for congregations to use to fundraise for the capital cost of 30 units for Indigenous individuals and families in a campaigned titled, *United We Dream*. The campaign title hearkens back to a previous and very successful campaign, *United We Stand*, where United Churches across the region were instrumental in fundraising for the creation of Veterans' House Canada: The Andy Carswell Building, a supportive housing facility for veterans only. To serve as some inspiration, meet two MHI residents who are giving back with grateful hearts.

Rosenie has lived at MHI's The Haven for approximately two years. When she and her two children aged 7 and 10 arrived from Haiti, they only had temporary accommodations with a family member. After that, she found herself living in a one-room motel which was very difficult, and her boys were not happy. With the help of a social worker, she applied and accepted a two-bedroom home with MHI.

She and her boys are happier than ever. They are doing well in a nearby French school and love playing with the other children at The Haven. Rosenie was an accountant in Haiti for 11 years. She wants to help others with creating their household budget and savings plans and is about to embark on providing financial literacy workshops to other MHI tenants. She is already giving back to the community that has welcomed her with open arms.

Connie has lived at MHI's The Haven since it opened in 2017. She had been on Ottawa's Housing Registry for a long time and has felt comfortable at The Haven since the very beginning. When she first moved in, the other tenants were very welcoming, and she now reaches out to other new tenants to help them feel at home in their new place.

Connie sees the community room and grounds as an extension of her home, and volunteers to maintain the spaces in an attractive and safe manner. She spends a lot of time in the community room, hanging out and tidying up either by herself or with the company of other women who live there. At the Annual Christmas Party, she dresses up as an elf or Mrs. Claus, helping to hand out gifts and cookies. Connie is grateful for The Haven and shows her appreciation by being as involved as possible.

Supporting United We Dream and the capital campaign for Indigenous homes is a powerful way for congregations to actively participate in Reconciliation with Canada's Indigenous Peoples, our brothers and sisters. By contributing, congregations can help empower marginalized communities, providing them with safe and affordable housing and opportunities to grow and thrive.

#### Ideas for Summer Family Ministry Week 3: Special Events & Encouraging Connections

Not every church has the ability to run a Vacation Bible School during Summer Break, but that doesn't mean there aren't other fantastic opportunities for ministry with families in your community. Check-out some of these great ideas from different United churches for inspiration.

#### **Special Events**

Consider hosting a special event like an ice cream sundae social, sing-a-long, field trip, movie night, or church picnic. Make sure to personally invite your families to attend, and ask if there are any

accommodations that can be made to encourage their participation. Considering the timing of the event for children with young families or those who work during the summer. Transportation can also go a long way to ensure participation. Focus on taking time to get-to-know your families better, encouraging mingling between older and younger church members. Could the movie be followed up with an intergenerational discussion time? Could fun conversation starters be left on the tables at the social? Or, consider playing People Bingo with a prize!

Britannia United Church in Ottawa ON hosts free family movies on Fridays in their Sanctuary. They offer a matinee and an evening movie – the afternoon film is geared more to seniors and the evening to children. They make a point to emphasis that all families are welcomed to join, including families of one, families without children, and chosen families. Sometimes movies are chosen to make you think and other times just for a "good belly laugh", says Rev. Jennifer Power.

#### **Encouraging Connections**

- · Pair up community members as "Summer Prayer Buddies", inviting them to pray for one another throughout the summer as folks enjoy their summer break.
- · Start a summer pen pal program where kids and seniors write letters to put in a "mail box" at the church on Sundays during the summer break. They can share stories about their adventures and pick-up letters when they're able to attend a service.
- · Make a community "scrapbook" of your summer where folks can add pictures and stories from their adventures.
- · Encourage children to offer their pictures or cards they make to be taken to residents in retirement and long-term care homes.
- · Encourage cottagers, campers, those on vacations to send in photos that might be put on a screen, or short video clips to say hello to those gathering.
