Faithful Footprints – What Could Your Community of Faith Do with an Eco-Grant?

Feeling the heat? Think "green" this summer!

On June 4, the United Church celebrated achieving 502 engagements in the Faithful Footprints program. This represents approximately 20% of all United Church communities of faith, with *an almost 24% reduction in national Greenhouse Gas emissions*! When we think Growth strategies, we may not immediately think of our creation care commitments, but *our future as a church is directly connected to environmental sustainability*. If your church hasn't reached out to Stephen Collette at Faithful Footprints yet, I encouraged you to do so. You can learn more about the program, as well as grants available to United Churches looking to complete energy efficiency and decarbonization building projects. 
Book Drop-Off
