
Are you from a Community of Faith that is seeking your next minister?

Responding as a community of faith to the rise in hate crimes against 2SLGBTQI people By Terri Mullin

You may have heard that Statistics Canada has reported that in 2023, hate crimes targeting sexual orientation increased 69% from the previous year. This alarming increase invites communities of faith to think about our national commitment to the just treatment of all of God's children.

As we sing in our A Song of Faith:

Jesus announced the coming of God's reign—

a commonwealth not of domination

but of peace, justice, and reconciliation. All churches, whether they have completed the Affirming Process or not, has a responsibility to speak out against homophobia and transphobia.

Near my hometown, in Southern New Brunswick, a local school just painted a rainbow crosswalk in front of their school. This crosswalk was defaced overnight. The message this sends to queer, trans and curious kids returning to school is devastating. As churches and ministries, we can offer a healing ministry of acceptance to children, youth and their families by loudly offering God's inclusive welcome. This public witness, a bold discipleship and daring justice, is also a ministry to those who feel entitled to act out with violence and hatred.

This fall, as you welcome old and new members back from the summer, I invite you to think about how you can include a message of inclusive welcome in all that you do. You never know whose life might be changed by that witness of God's steadfast loving kindness.

MHI – News Update



Since 2002, MHI has created a strong foundation for its work in providing homes for some of those 12,000 men, women and children on the housing registry in Ottawa. Currently, MHI is building at LeBreton Flats. Dream LeBreton will be comprised of 601 apartments, 133 of which will be owned and operated by MHI and 30 of those will be designated for <u>Indigenous individuals or families</u>. MHI has a goal of \$1.6 million to offset the capital cost of building the 30 units for Indigenous people. Raising funds for these units is a concrete step congregations can take to strengthen Right Relationships with All Our Relations. The proposal is that EOORC fundraise to help support these Indigenous units.

On June 1st, at the 2024 Annual General Meeting, a motion was passed:

That EOORC endorse the approval of the EOORC Executive that congregations be allowed to raise funds for the Dream LeBreton Capital Campaign with a goal of \$150,000.

We are asking congregations to create their own campaigns over the next two years to raise funds and help us meet our goal. All amounts raised, large or small, help us reach our objective.


To help raise awareness of MHI within EOORC and to encourage support for providing affordable housing, particularly for Indigenous persons, Rev. Dr. Teresa Burnett Cole has graciously created and delivered an Indigenous style worship service. This service was offered and videotaped at Glebe St. James on April 7, 2024. Rev. Teresa has given copyright permission for the prayers and hymn/songs and sermon she wrote for the service. The video can be used in part or in whole.
