The excitement around the United Church of Canada Centennial is growing! We're hearing from many communities of faith who are holding services and activities in celebration; is your group planning something? Don't forget that the Foundation's <u>Centennial Granting Fund</u> offers funding for these special events, emphasizing the importance of uniting to commemorate the milestone anniversary. Communities of faith and other organizations can apply for grants of up to \$5,000.



The Fall 2024 grant round is open! We've mentioned that it's unlike any other, so we want to draw your attention to some upcoming application deadlines and a few helpful resources!

- <u>Seeds of Hope</u> applications are due October 15.
- Rowntree Scholarship applications are due October 15.
- Alvin Dixon Memorial Bursary applications are due September 15.
- <u>Promotion Project Fund</u> applications are due October 15. At this time, this is the only scheduled
 granting opportunity from this fund, so don't miss your chance! Check out the marketing
 resources we've listed in the fund description to help get you started.
- <u>Centennial Granting Fund</u> applications are due September 15. Following this, the next application intake will begin immediately and close December 15. As we mentioned about, visit united-church.ca/100years to download the Centennial Toolkit.
- <u>United, we</u> applications are due October 15. The fund will grant next in Fall 2025.

Applications now available: Community Sport and Recreation Infrastructure Fund

This grant opportunity might be of interest to some Communities of Faith in EOORC

"The Ministry of Sport is excited to announce applications are now being accepted for the <u>Community Sport and Recreation Infrastructure Fund (CSRIF)</u>. This new \$200-million, three-year infrastructure fund will support Ontario's growing communities with new and revitalized local sport and recreation facilities across the province.

The CSRIF is a two-stream, application-based funding program.

- Stream 1: Repair and Rehabilitation Funding between \$150,000 and \$1 million to extend the lifespan of existing community sport and recreation facilities/spaces and improve local programming and accessibility features to meet community need.
 - o Application deadline is Tuesday, October 29, 2024, at 5 p.m. (ET).
- Stream 2: New Builds/Signature New Builds Funding up to \$10 million to invest in new, transformative community sport and recreation infrastructure, including assets that do not currently exist in a community or the replacement of existing assets that have reached the end of their lifespan.
 - Applications will be accepted on an ongoing basis until all funding has been allocated. Interested applicants are encouraged to apply early.

Autumn Update from The Ottawa Pastoral Care and Training Program

This fall we again offer the Basic Training Course both in-person (afternoons) and online by Zoom (evenings). Both courses begin Monday, September 16, 2024 and run weekly until November 25, 2024 (excluding Thanksgiving Monday). News from the General Council Office




The <u>August 13th</u> issue discusses a recent surge in hate crimes against the 2SLGBTQIA+ community.
