Good News Story: Renovations at Trinity United Church Kazabazua



Trinity United Church in Kazabazua, Quebec, recently completed a major phase of building renovations. All eight leaking windows were replaced, which will greatly reduce heating costs this winter. The old disused furnace chimneys were restored, and the roof and outdoor walls painted. A new sign was installed on the church, and another will soon be placed near the road. The congregation uses printed signs and social media to share service times and other information with their local community.

The Trinity United Church congregation knows that the church is more than a building. One member of the congregation commented: "If we are having a Halloween event for children and a child spills glitter all over the floor, that is ok – we have vacuums for a reason! The most important thing is welcoming these kids and telling them about God's love." At the same time, a well kept church building can be an important tool in being the Church.

The project was made possible with financial support from the EOORC Church Extension Fund and from Glen Cairn United Church, who generously shared a budget surplus with Trinity Kazabazua. EOORC rep Alan Herbert writes: "Many families have supported the Trinity UC Kazabazua building fund for many years. But our building fund alone was not sufficient for the scope of the work needed. We are very grateful for the financial support received from Glen Cairn United Church and the EOORC Church Extension Fund without which this project would not have been possible."


Growth-Related Opportunities


