### Good News Story – Salem United Church

Salem United Church has sparked an innovative project in South Glengarry. Seniors in the church and beyond have been working together to weave together mats for people experiencing homelessness. The mats, which are made out of recycled milk bags, provide a good surface for sleeping bags, helping to keep them dry and off the cold ground.

The story was featured in *The Recorder and Times*. Shawn O'Neill writes: "The local mat-making took off with the Salem United Church's community drop-in group, which currently meets there every Tuesday from 2-4 p.m. Casgrain-Robertson said that in addition to enjoying a friendly game of euchre and snacks, attendees began to work on weaving the mats together, creating a community within a community."

# Our regional celebration will be in Ottawa, and that is a long drive from my home. How can my community of faith participate?

We encourage all communities of faith to join us at the EY Centre in Ottawa. We will provide a grant application template for communities of faith who would like to run a bus to the event. If you are not able to come in person, a live stream will be available on YouTube.

My community of faith received a letter from the "Friends of the United Church Foundation" which talked about cluster services to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Is this an initiative of the region? Some of you have likely received a letter from Brian Arthur Brown under the title of "Friends of the United Church Foundation". The letter shared invitations to cluster services, Centennial worship resources, and an online worship service on June 10<sup>th</sup>. We feel it is necessary to highlight that these are not events in which the Regional Council nor the General Council is involved. Rev. Brown has created this project and is driving it. While you are welcome to join him in his proposed activity, we want to be particularly clear that this is not a requirement nor an expectation. Our Regional Council's official celebration will be held on June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025 at the EY Centre. The official denominational national service will be held online in St. John's NL on June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

#### Christmas Services – Inviting Your Local Community

Christmas is the perfect time of year to invite others to join your community of faith in worship. Here are a few tips!

- Be sure to put Christmas worship times on your website, social media (church and local community pages), local community notice boards, classified ads or other places where you communicate. This is best done early and then again closer to the date some people make Christmas plans in November, and some make plans a day or two before.
- Publicize Christmas Eve worship, but also other special services like Blue Christmas.
- Take pictures at pageants, Christmas Eve and other events, and share them. (Make sure you ask consent before posting any photos of people!)
- Did you know that <u>70-85% of people who visit a church come because they were invited by someone</u> <u>they know</u>? Encourage your community of faith to invite their family, friends and neighbours to Christmas worship and activities.
- Post your event on the EOORC Website. Here is an example post from <u>St. Andrew's United Church in</u> <u>Cumberland</u>, who are hosting a daytime Christmas Eve service – perfect for folks who don't like driving in the dark, who have young children at home, or who are busy with family dinners in the evening.

He walked 1458kms carrying his backpack across mountains, fields and coasts while holding communities of faith and ministry personnel in prayer.
