Worshiplude is a winter worship and fellowship event for youth and young adults (ages 10+) hosted by the Eastern Ontario Outaouais Region (EOOR) of the United Church of Canada that coincides with Winterlude in Ottawa.

It's been happening for over 20 years and is a combination of "Worship" + "Winterlude" = Worshiplude. Individuals and Groups attend Winterlude activities during the day and then gather Saturday night for collective dinner, worship/communion and hang...until 11pm.

#### Learnings from Gibimishkaadimin Canoe-Camping Trip for Indigenous Reconciliation

Rousseau Whiteley has taken time to share about his experience on the Gibimishkaadimin youth canoecamping trip for Indigenous reconciliation.

"Before the trip, I couldn't identify the smell of a smudge or the taste of cedar tea, both things I now will never forget. I also couldn't have expressed how it felt to be in nature and to feel the living world around me, in the way Gibimishkaadimin taught me that I could. This change might be intangible, but I'd argue that it was the most important change. I will never feel the same, walking through the forest, thinking about the world or literally anywhere for that matter. The experience forever changed me."

#### Advent Greetings from Campus Ministry at Algonquin College

The Algonquin Community Chaplaincy writes: "We want to thank the Ottawa area United Church community for their continued support of Campus Ministry at Algonquin College in 2024. Through the past financial support of individual congregations, such as City View, Emmanuel, Dominion-Chalmers, and Glen Cairn, and the ongoing support of the Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council (and before that, Ottawa Presbytery) we have been able to staff a paid part-time ecumenical Christian chaplain in the college's Spiritual Centre since 2006.

We have also benefited from the volunteer work (past and present) of ministers and licensed lay worship leaders such as Dana Ducette, Eric Lukacs, Gail Christy, George Hermanson, Neil Wallace, and Joyce Morris as well as members of various United Church congregations such as Knox (see photo below), Carleton Memorial, and City View. This work has included pastoral care, hosting Trivia fundraising nights, providing food and support during exam week (for many years, organized by City View's Ruth Anne Carney), and serving on the Campus Ministry Board." #### Seniors Community Grant Program

The Seniors Community Grant (SCG) Program funds local not-for-profit organizations and individuals representing local unincorporated community groups to deliver projects, supports and resources that help older adults (aged 55+) live independently, ensure their safety and security, connect them to their community, avoid isolation and help them achieve greater financial security and social connections. Grants are available between \$1,000 and \$25,000.
