Good News Story – Bethel United Church, Rideau Ferry

Bethel United Church (Rideau Ferry, ON) recently completed a energy-efficient renovation with help from a Faithful Footprints Grant. This included the installation of energy-efficient installation, radiant heaters, a heat pump, LED lighting, efficient ceiling fans, sealing windows, insulating pipes and making sure that the church is accessible to everyone, "including the installation of a fully accessible bathroom." The renovations are designed to lower energy costs and carbon emissions.

The project was featured by the Lanark Climate Network in an article here. The Climate Network wrote: "This project is a powerful example of what can happen when individuals and organizations come together for the greater good. It is a story of environmental stewardship, community engagement, and a commitment to making the world a better place, one building at a time. The future looks bright for Bethel United Church, not only as a place of worship but as a symbol of what can be achieved when communities come together to make a positive impact on both their surroundings and the world at large."


Bus Grants

U.C.W.'s are encouraged to add these celebrations to the <u>centennial map</u> so that others may join worship that day!




"Carrying the Light Into the Ordinary" ...
