Multifaith Housing Initiative Update FEB'25

There is lots of activity at MHI these days as we work to integrate with Gloucester Housing buildings and tenants. It is going well.

The Dream LeBreton project is progressing as planned. The project has a new name: Odenak. The Algonquin word for village. There are two huge cranes in place, busy building. We are told that by the spring, the buildings will be up, above ground. Final completion is planned for DEC'27. The building containing MHI units will be completed first but our rent-up cannot start until both building are approved for occupancy.

The United We Dream capital campaign for Dream LeBreton is going very well. We are over 50% of the way to our target of \$150,000! Every one of EOOR's pastoral charges are listed in the MHI website under United We Dream. 
