### Congratulations to St. John's United Church in Cardinal Faithful Footprints Grant Approval

St. John's United Church recently applied and was approved for a grant through the Faithful Footprints program.

Jim Grant of St. John's United writes: "We are certainly pleased here at St. John's United in Cardinal on receiving approval of our Faithful Footprints Grant application to reduce our Carbon Footprint. This grant will allow us to do some much needed work to our facilities to help reduce our carbon footprint. The work will include replacing the 10 old vintage 1963 electric motors in our radiators & fan blowers in the Gymnasium and hallways which we rely on for heat. It will include new circulating ceiling fans in the sanctuary which are reversible to move the air in winter and summer, also removing a huge stain-glass window from the east side of our building and bricking it up as well as removing and bricking up a large north window in our Gymnasium and new energy efficient front doors to the Sanctuary. It will certainly help to keep our doors open for worship well into the future."
