A Courage and Hope

On May 3 at 2 pm, Bells Corners U.C will host a showing of the film "Living Below the Line", presenting true and thought provoking stories of poverty in Canada.

In 2022, fifteen individuals living with poverty in Waterloo Region worked with theatre artists to co-create a play about their lives. Scenes cover stigma, addiction, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), bias in education, the medical system maze, partner abuse, discrimination and homelessness.

Community co-creators perform stories about their own and each others' struggles, courage, and hope.

This well-received play has now been filmed to share these important stories more widely. You are invited to join Bells Corners United Church to watch the film, which is about 1 hour long. Following the film, three of the actors from the play will join by Zoom for a short 'talkback' session. Refreshments will be served. There is no charge for this event.
