
Hiring a Student Minister: a workshop on Appointments with a student for a Supervised Ministry Experience (SME), or a Diaconal Field Placement.

Keeping in Touch Team Looking for Members

There's a new leadership team getting started in the Region. Several people have already expressed interest and we are looking for 3-5 more people to join the team! Team members will be assigned a list of Pastoral Charges in the Region to Keep in Touch with. We are looking for lay, ordered and retired members of the Region to join this Team. (This team is outside of formal Pastoral Relations work such as a Pastoral Charge Supervisor or a Liaison.)

Each team member will be assigned approximately 10-13 pastoral charges to keep in touch with! Team members will connect with the congregations on their list several times a year, by phone. They will connect with the clergy and lay rep(s) from each congregation to check in with them and ask questions such as: "How are you doing? "Is there anything the Region can help you with?" The hope is that these conversations can help clergy and lay reps to feel more connected to the Region/United Church of Canada.
